Hazel Watts celebrated her 102nd birthday on Tuesday 7th June

Hazel's grandfather, Henry, arrived in Dunolly in 1854. Edward Watts, Henry's son, married Mary Jane McGhie and settled down in Dunolly.

Hazel was born in Dunolly and until recently had always lived here. Her family lived in Maude Street until Hazel was six years old. They then moved to the cottage opposite the motel. Hazel lived in the cottage for 96 years.

Hazel went to school in Dunolly until year 8. She remembers using a wooden edged slate and searching for pieces of slate on Gooseberry Hill. Unfortunately her many friends are no longer with us.

Hazel worked as a waitress and maid at the Railway Hotel. Later she worked at the mill for 27 years.

Hazel never married and was much in demand to help out when friends or family members were ill. She remembers looking after Fred and his numerous brothers and sisters. In particular she remembered looking after Ross and Lionel who were very small babies.

When Mrs Richards went on holidays Hazel would look after the children. She enjoyed going to the dances with all the young teenagers from south Dunolly. Any who didn't stay in the hall were never taken again. They would all walk to and from the dances.

Hazel loved going to community singing in the town hall. At 10 o'clock all the chairs were stacked up and they would dance until midnight. When asked what her favourite memory was she replied quickly, "Getting the road out front tared". Fred, Quin and I enjoyed morning tea with Hazel on Saturday. Hazel is still very sprightly and on the go and no way does she look her age. Her only concession to being 102 is now she relies on a walker to get around. She spends her time knitting for the homeless and nursing home patients. Her niece Rhonda sews the many blankets up and distributes them around Geelong. Last time we visited she displayed a worn out pair of knitting needles.

Hazel now resides with her niece Rhonda in a leafy, quiet area of Geelong. Sammy, Hazel's devoted little dog is always on hand for a pat when visitors arrive.

The Watts family and her many friends wish her a very happy 102nd birthday.

When one door closes another opens

It was sad to hear that we will be losing the much loved mobile library service that has served our community so well. However, out of adversity opportunity comes, and for Dunolly this is one of those moments. The mobile service is costing over \$400 an hour to deliver and this gives Dunolly residents 3 hours per week, for 46 weeks a year. The current service does not allow people to access the library most of the week, and does not suit those who would love to access it, but cannot get into town on Thursday afternoons. A permanent library would allow more people to access it and would enable more hours of access. It is within council's budget that is already allocated for library services for Dunolly to offer a temporary library service, while funds are obtained from the Government's Living Libraries funding. Scam Alert

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission is warning the public to be alert to scams offering fake gift cards or vouchers in return for disclosing credit card and other personal information.

"This year, the ACCC's Scamwatch has received 1,175 complaints about fake surveys, emails and social media posts misusing the names and logos of big retailers such as JB Hi-fi, Bunnings, Coles and Woolworths, with \$2,600 in total reported lost. These losses are the tip of the iceberg as the scammer's target is your personal information to help them scam you again in the future," ACCC Deputy Chair Delia Rickard said.

"Scammers use fake gift card promotions to trick consumers into handing over their personal information such as banking details or passwords, which are later used to steal your money or your identity, or to on-sell to other scammers."

"Protect your personal information by verifying whether an offer is legitimate by checking if it is listed on the retailers' official website or by calling the retailers' official customer service line."

How these scams work

- You receive an email or text message out of the blue, or come across a social media post, claiming that you have been selected to receive or have the chance to win a gift card from a well-known company.
- The email, message or post appears legitimate, using brand names and official logos to convince you it's the real deal.
- As with many legitimate offers and online posts, you might be asked to complete a survey or pass on an offer to others before you can claim the gift card or voucher.
- Upon completing the survey, forwarding or accepting the offer you will generally be directed to a wellconstructed webpage. Here, you will be prompted to provide personal information such as your phone number, address and bank account details.
- After handing over your personal information, you
 may receive a fake gift voucher or alternatively,
 receive nothing at all. You may also begin to receive
 unsolicited emails and phone calls requesting more
 information that the scammer may use to commit

identity theft and other fraud.

Protect yourself

- Be alert to unsolicited offers while some offers may be legitimate sometimes they are scams and can be very difficult to identify – it's always best to check independently every time.
- Verify the offer Always check whether an offer is genuine, even those passed on from people you know. Contact the relevant retailer using contact details you get from a phone book or independent online search.
- Avoid clicking links don't rely on links or phone numbers appearing in an offer – these can direct you to fake websites or download malware. If you get an email supposedly from a well-known company, before clicking, hover your computer mouse over the URL or link. If the address after the '@' symbol doesn't end with the company's name and .com, it's likely to be a scam.
- Take your time many scams will claim the offer is limited to try and create a sense of urgency. Don't be rushed into handing over your personal information.
- Consider your privacy Only provide information such as Medicare numbers and credit card security codes to organisations you can trust – requests of this nature should ring alarm bells.
- Report If you think you have provided your account details to a scammer, contact your financial institution immediately.





A new mental health resource produced by Bendigo Loddon Primary Care Partnership's Mental A to Z Network (MAZN) will make finding services in Bendigo and Loddon easier for people living with a mental illness. Created in partnership with 20 local health and community organisations, the 'Mental Health Matters to Us All' poster aims to increase awareness of the prevalence and symptoms of mental illness, reduce stigma and reassure people that with the right support recovery is possible.

MAZN member and co-founder of HALT Australia, Jeremy Forbes, said "About 45 per cent of Aussies will encounter mental illness during their lives, which means most of us have a mate or family member who have lived that experience.

"For many of us it's hard to know how to support our loved ones and finding the right advice can be tricky if you don't know where to start", said Mr Forbes.

"With 'Mental Health Matters to Us All' we want to encourage people to talk to their mates, colleagues and family members, ask if they're ok and if there are concerns assist them to seek help. Services are available locally; with the right help and a good support network, people can recover to lead healthy, productive and satisfying lives."

To celebrate the launch of 'Mental Health Matters to Us All', MAZN are hosting a free event at the Queen Elizabeth Oval, Bendigo on Tuesday 14 June 2016 at 12 noon. Health and community services, businesses and community members are encouraged to attend and participate in a group photograph to be taken on the oval to show support for residents living with mental illness and the local services who work tirelessly to support them

Photographing Vicuna

Entry in The Welcome Record Animal Story
By Gregory Fitzgerald



I have been a keen photographer since the age of ten when I started using my parents' Brownie camera. My teen years involved using other peoples' cameras, but I was able to learn 35mm photography. I bought my Minolta SLR at age 21 and this camera travelled with me on many journeys and never let me down.

In 1976 I travelled with a small group in Peru and we stopped in the middle of nowhere for a lunch break. Domesticated llamas and alpacas were a common sight, but their wild cousins the vicunas were different. These small shy creatures always ran away when humans approached. To get near wild animals I had learned you always had to be

downwind, so to get this photo I had to detour through several gullies and then climb a rocky outcrop to get a good vantage point.

I crouched behind a rock and tried to work out the exposure as I would only have an instant to snap the picture. I gripped the telephoto lens so the focus would not change, sprang to my feet and fired. The picture shows that five of the seven animals had already seen me and a second later their white tails were disappearing into the distance.

Now forty years on I regard this as my most memorable animal photograph.

Historic Avoca Station to be transformed into Arts Hub

The historic Avoca Railway Station building will be refurbished and become part of the day-to-day life of the community once again.

Parliamentary Secretary to the Premier, Colin Brooks, visited the 140 year old building today to announce calls for tender for the restoration work, which will convert the currently disused building into a thriving arts hub.

The restoration will include demolition, internal and external restoration and landscaping. The project will include installing new windows, doors, accessible toilets, kitchen, electrical services, fencing, asphalt and paving. Once complete, the historic building will become a permanent space for visual and performing arts, flexible community meeting and event space, kitchen. The surrounds will provide the opportunity to develop a propagation centre, and community garden.

The Pyrenees Shire Council will lease the building on behalf of the Avoca Community Arts and Gardening Inc, who will run the new space.

The buildings in the Avoca Station precinct were constructed in 1876 and are the best remaining example of the 'Dunolly style' railway building.

The works will be managed by Victorian rail asset owner VicTrack on behalf of the Andrews Labor Government. Tenders opened last week and will close on Thursday 16

June. The tender is likely to be awarded by the end of July, with construction to begin shortly after. Works are expected to be complete in late 2016. For more information about the tender, visit www.tenderlink.com/victrack/.




