Dunolly Biosolids Plant to Improve Soil

A newly-completed Biosolids Base facility in Dunolly is set to increase the processing of biosolids for long -term sustainable reuse.

Biosolids are organic material left-over after sewage treatment and can be used to improve soil quality and crop yield. There has been an increase in the generation of biosolids in our region due to population growth.

Construction of the 10-hectare site at the Dunolly Water Reclamation Plant began last July. Coliban Water General Manager Operations Julian Bull said the completion of the facility last December is a winwin for local farmers and the broader community who will benefit from biosolids.

"The Dunolly facility will become a regional solution, equipped to accept biosolids from any of our water reclamation plants. Farmers who already use our biosolids have reported increased yields and improved soil health. They are also cheaper and more sustainable than other types of fertilizer" Mr Bull said.

Biosolids deliveries to site will begin from early 2024. and will be unloaded at the tipping point and each year, during the warmer months, are windrowed to accelerate drying.


"This is done to reduce the moisture concentration in the solids through open-air evaporation," Mr Bull explained. The drying season usually runs from October to May (depending on weather), but the base will accept biosolids year-round.

The first processed biosolids will be available for reuse in 2027.

Dunolly Community Garden News

The Dunolly Community Garden recently held a "hands-on" workshop on Wicking Beds.

With more than 20 attending, the workshop led by David from Carramar Nursery, Maryborough was a wealth of information and a great introduction for anyone to learn how to create a DIY wicking bed. So what are wicking beds? *"Invented by an Australian named Colin Austin, the idea with a wicking bed is that you prevent water from leaving the bottom of the bed with a waterproof liner or layer. This creates a water reservoir underneath the soil. Then, rather than having to irrigate by watering from above (via drip irrigation, a hose, watering can etc), the water literally wicks UP into the soil from below, keeping it nice and moist."

Essentially, a wicking bed "wick" draws water up through several defined layers (lasagna style) of a water reservoir, volcanic rock (which is porous and keeps water in the reservoir), geotextile material (stops the water going down into the reservoir), Soil (with added perlite) with several pipes strategically placed to access and feed the water reservoir.

Some tips from David:-

- For the volcanic rock layer, basalt is recommended (15 ml) the bigger the size may be good for the water reservoir, the less effective for wicking.
- Place geotextile strips between the stones for better wicking abilities



Wicking strips of geotextile placed before adding basalt as the bottom layer with a slotted drain pipe.

- The soil layer added on top of the geotextile material should be 250-300 mm in height.
- Add 10% Perlite to the soil for better drainage.

After planting your seeds/ seedlings, mulch well and water the bed everyday for at least 4-5 days to ensure your plantings survive until the wicking bed starts to take care of itself.

Most of the required materials (apart from the basalt) may be obtained from Carramar Nursery – just ask David.

Believe it or not! Over the Christmas break I went outside (putting on the light) and got 'Bopped' on the head by a Christmas beetle. It was a real Christmas blessing. I can remember as a child they heralded the warm summer evenings and were plentiful in numbers. It was engaging to collect the attractive beetle bodies when life span ended to make a collection as children do.






Being a large beetle about the size of an almond and similar in colour. They have iridescent stripes on their body and very sticky legs. The Christmas beetle are adept at flying and needless to say are nocturnal. The species live in the ground for two years then emerging briefly to mate and complete their life cycle. The word is Christmas beetles have become rare due to varying reasons — the use of pesticides and the loss of habitat. Imagine being in the ground and trying to emerge only to find a large area of concrete or asphalt has been placed over your home! No escape, shudder!

We really don't consider or protect the surrounding areas for insect life cycles.




